2011 American Folk Festival adds Artists to Schedule

BANGOR, Maine – Organizers of the American Folk Festival on the Bangor Waterfront today announced the names of six additional performing groups who are scheduled to appear at the event in August. They are: *Bing Xia*, *Samba Ngo*, *ReVeillons!*, *The Brotherhood Singers*, *Pedrito Martinez*, and *The Stooges Brass Band*.

2011 will mark the tenth year of a traditional arts music festival on Bangor's waterfront, and these performers are just some of the 17 groups that will participate in the August event.

RéVeillons! (whose name means "Wake up!") will bring their unique Quebecois harmonies, percussion, and dance to the Festival stages, sharing the irresistible music of the Franco culture shared by many Maine residents. The rich repertoire of Quebec musical tradition will come to life masterfully when ReVeillons! takes the Festival stages.
