

## Thank you for volunteering for **On-Site Transportation**

**Before the start of your shift, please check-in at Volunteer Registration, which is located near the Railroad Stage shuttle drop-off.**

**Volunteer Registration will direct you to the golf cart corral, where you will check-in with Peter or Jeff.**

Here's what you can expect: As an on-site transportation driver, you will be on-call for any and all on-site transporting needs. Usually this means festival-goers who have limited mobility and need a lift from one place to another on site or performers who need a lift from one stage to another. You may also find yourself transporting staff or instruments.

### **TIPS:**

This year, there will be designated performer drop off and pick up points at each stage. Your area leader will provide details when you arrive for your shift.

For those of you who will be transporting performers, each group has an artist buddy who is responsible for getting their group where they need to be. They are the person to look for when picking up performers at a stage. Artist buddies can be identified by their red volunteer t-shirts.

THIS YEAR THERE IS MANDATORY **ON-SITE TRANSPORTATION TRAINING** TAKING PLACE after orientation ON Tuesday August 16<sup>th</sup> from 6:30-7:30pm.

### **Important Notes:**

1. The AFF must pay for any damage done to golf carts. Please drive with utmost care.
  2. The task of driving a golf cart through the crowded Festival site can be challenging. Drive slowly when near crowds of people, and make sure that people nearby have seen you before driving into an opening in the crowd.
  3. Performances are recorded; please do not use horns when you are near a stage. Please use horns only when absolutely necessary, and for the shortest time possible. Do not use horns to "greet" people. Please use your best judgment and be considerate so that everyone can enjoy the shows.
  4. A suggested travel route will be given to you at the start of your shift. Please follow this route whenever possible. The route is designed to help you avoid the congested areas at the Festival.
  5. When you are on-duty, the other seats in the cart are for festival-goers, performers and staff ONLY. Driving a golf cart is not an opportunity for you to drive around your friends and family.
- Please be aware – if you are seen driving recklessly (excessive speed for the crowded conditions, driving too close to people, etc.), your permission to drive a golf cart on site will be revoked for the remainder of the 2010 festival, and for all future years.

*SAFETY FIRST - remember that safety is **ALWAYS** more important than speed.*
